<p>Csar Nicholas II – King of Russia, overthrown by the Russian Revolution (Bolshevik Revolution)</p>	<p>Mr. Jones</p>	<p>“Some of the animals talked of the duty of loyalty to Mr. Jones, whom they referred to as ‘Master,’ or made elementary remarks such as ‘Mr. Jones feeds us’” (Orwell 6).</p>
<p>Karl Marx/ Vladimir Lenin – intellectual leader of the Bolshevik Revolution, promoted the ideas of communism</p>		
<p>Communism – political and economic system designed to create equality among the people</p>		
<p>Joseph Stalin – leader of the USSR after Lenin’s death, known to a man of few words, large in stature and feared by many</p>		
<p>Leon Trotsky – the intellectual leader of the USSR and head of the Red Army, known to be an effective writer</p>		
<p>Agitpropist – communist party members that engage in spreading messages designed to make people believe in communism</p>		

*Corollary – an immediate consequence or easily drawn conclusion

<p>Russian Orthodox Church – national religion of country, promised salvation in the next life, supported Czar Nicholas II</p>		
<p>Cheka (Secret Police) – enforcers of the new communist government in the USSR (formerly Russia)</p>		
<p>Peasants/Proletariat/Workers – not educated, hardworking, follow the leader without protest</p>		
<p>Upper Class/Nobility/Bourgeoisie – they were loyal to the monarchy, and lived comfortable lives well above the working classes</p>		
<p>5 Year Plan (Industrialization) – a government plan in the USSR to increase industrial and economic output</p>		
<p>“The Internationale” – a song written about the working class and its victory over the ruling classes of society</p>		
<p>Communist Manifesto – political pamphlet written by Karl Marx, outlining the principles of communism; and the importance of workers engaging in a revolution</p>
